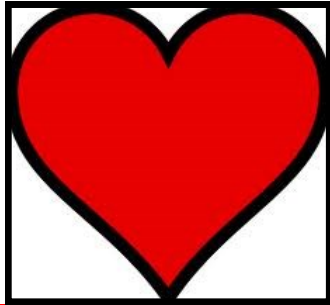

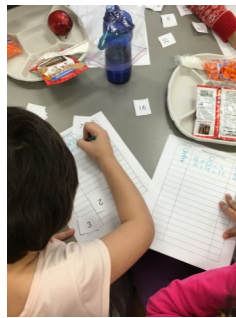
#### We are a *Respect for ALL Award Winning School*

## Parent-Teacher Conferences

On Thursday, March 3rd, we will hold Spring Parent-Teacher Conferences. There will be a half day on March 3rd, and **all students will be dismissed at 12 noon.** Afternoon conferences are scheduled from 1:00 – 3:00 p.m. and evening conferences from 5:00 – 8:00 p.m. Before you meet with your child's classroom teacher, you will have the opportunity to view your child's portfolio outside the classroom. The work samples will be indicative of your child's academic progress. If you have any concerns or questions, the conference is an excellent time to discuss them with your child's teacher.

## *Learning Environment Survey—Your Voice Counts!*

Your voice counts! The 10th annual Learning Environment Survey lets all Department of Education (DOE) families give feedback about their schools. The survey is aligned to the DOE's Framework for Great Schools and will collect vital information about our school's capacity to improve students achievement by measuring six essential elements—Rigorous Instruction, Supportive Environment, Collaborative Teachers, Effective School Leadership, Strong Family and Community Ties and Trust.

Last year only 75% of our families filled out the survey. We must do better. This year we're aiming for 100%! Surveys will be handed out on March 3rd, during Parent-Teacher Conferences. In order to make it more convenient for families to complete the survey during Parent Teacher Conferences, we will be putting a laptop on the desk outside of each classroom. This year, for the first time, families will be able to complete surveys on their smart phones. While waiting for your appointment, it only takes a few minutes, PLEASE complete your survey.

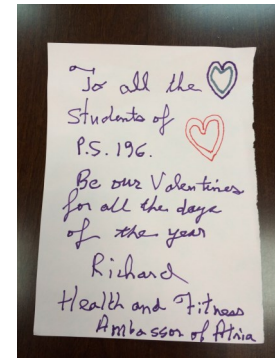


# COMMUNITY CONNECTION

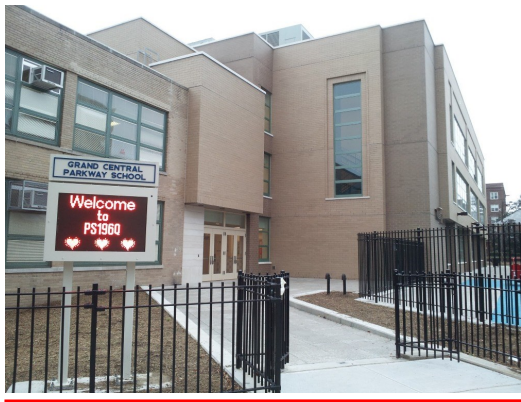
### Data-Tech Workshop—Navigating NYC School Account—March 23rd at 7:30 p.m.—Morning Workshop

**PS196Q 2015-2016 Goal Highlights**

- Our teachers will continue to create differentiated, rigorous lessons with multiple entry points in order to engage high-achieving students in all grades in cognitively challenging work.
- We will focus on the progress of our students with disabilities, English as a New Language (ENL) students and at-risk students, with regard to their writing. Teachers will use the concepts of Universal Design for Learning and differentiation to embed multiple entry points into instruction, and we will measure their progress by analyzing their performance on writing tasks.
- We will renew our commitment to making sure that each individual child is supported both socially and emotionally, by using our resources to ensure that all staff are properly trained on how to support students and improve their relationships with their peers.
- We will work toward building capacity within our building, by increasing the number of teachers taking on leadership roles across grade levels and interest areas, including a data specialist, vertical team leaders, conflict resolution specialist, and more.
- We will create new opportunities for parents and guardians to become involved in school-related activities, such as Family Fun Fridays, Science Fun Day, Family Math Night and additional classroom celebrations
